The year kicked off with the continuation of the girls' council project from the previous year which aimed to end child marriage in Mpongwe district. Throughout the year, we had exciting Candid pride outreaches done with the help of our volunteers. We also had new exciting projects such as Health Action for Adolescents and Youths in Zambia which is supported by Action Aid Zambia and is being implemented and we have expanded to the Eastern Province with a policy communication based project supported by Champions of Global Reproductive Rights (PAI).

On the other hand, our other team of dedicated staff and volunteers in collaboration with Friends was spending time with female inmates at Lusaka Central Prison speaking about menstrual health management and also distributed sanitary pads to the inmates.

SPORTS AND SRHR-YOUTH DAY

Copper Rose Zambia in partnership with Bauleni United Sports Academy (BUSA) reached out to adolescents in sports with information on SRHR and MHM during an Edusport event on Youth day. This was a soccer activity which was titled, 'Dare to dream community champions league finale.' This brought together over 300players

from around Lusaka and it was held at Prince Takamado grounds in Bauleni. Copper Rose took advantage of the many youths that participated in the tournament and shared SRHR information and distributed MHM products and condoms to the players before they got on the pitch.

HAAYZ PROJECT

This year Copper Rose Zambia in partnership with Action Aid Zambia started implementing the Health Action for adolescents and Youths in Zambia (HAAYZ) project in Mazabuka district of southern province. The main goal of this project is to improve accountability of **SRHR** and awareness for adolescents and young people in Mazabuka. The project is supporting 5 health facilities (through adolescent friendly spaces) namely; Lubombo, Magoye, Nakambala, Kaleya and Kaonga and is intended to run for 3 years.

Among other activities under HAAYZ, CRZ has trained at least 20 in smart advocacy for SRH-R commodities, trained young people and NHCs in ADH SRH policies. Other activities included; radio shows, community

outreaches, roadshows, stakeholder engagements, Technical working group meetings at national and facility level among others.

these outlined activities. Through Copper Rose managed to reach out to a number of adolescents in Mazabuka. disseminated SRHR information to adolescents and young people and aided the peer educators at facility level to be able to advocate for their own SRHR commodities and be able to participate in TWG meetings at facility level. The other achievement is that through the awareness programs that Copper Rose did, all the five CRZ supported facilities recorded a growth in numbers of how many adolescents are coming and participating in the adolescent friendly spaces at the facility level.

CANDID PRIDE

Copper Rose Zambia conducts a campaign called Candid Pride every year and this year it brought a lot of partnerships with other organisations, it exposed CRZ into having interactions with

key populations like the inmates, the street kids and the differently abled adolescents from Amos foundation in Kafue. It is a campaign that was started in August 2015 to break the silence on

menstruation and sexual and reproductive health among adolescents in Zambian communities. The outreach activities that CRZ conducted this year were aimed at raising awareness



about menstrual health management, breaking the barriers and myths surrounding menstruation and distribution MHM of products to young girls and key populations and even teaching them how make washable pads.

OUR FINANCES

WHATS AHEAD

2020 is anticipated to be one of the most exciting years yet for CRZ. We expect to implement at least 5 projects across 3 provinces.

CRZ will be implementing two new projects in the coming year and thus expanding to new districts. A safe abortion project in Nyimba and Petauke district of Eastern province with support from SAAF and a condom distribution and SRHR focussed project in tertiary institutions in Lusaka supported by HIVOS. Furthermore, CRZ has just recently joined the Eastern and Southern Africa consortium on youth SRHR and we are excited to see what this new collaboration looks like and what impact it will have on AYSRHR in Zambia.



We will continue with the PAI and HAAYZ projects as well as candid pride and we hope to introduce more projects during the course of the year in order to reach as many young people as possible.

We will kick start our journey with a staff retreat to plan for 2020 soon after the festival break and we invite you to stay with us on this journey as we continue advancing adolescent and youth sexual and reproductive health and rights including Menstrual health management.
